## **DUI Checkpoint Nets 3 DUI Arrests and 6 Citations for Unlicensed Drivers**

The Huntington Beach Police Department conducted a Sobriety and Drivers License checkpoint on Friday, December 27th, 2013 from 7:05 PM to 2:20 AM. Checkpoints are placed in locations that have the greatest opportunity for achieving drunk and drugged driving deterrence and provide the greatest safety for officers and the public. Over the past year, there have been 7 alcohol related collisions on Main Street. These resulted in 3 injuries to the vehicles occupants. There has also been 42 citations issued to drivers on Main Street for being unlicensed or driving on a suspended/revoked license.

Sobriety/Drivers License checkpoints help lower DUI related deaths and injuries. A major component of these checkpoints is the deterrent effect it has on those who might drive drunk and/or drug impaired, unlicensed, or with a suspended/revoked license. Checkpoints help to bring more awareness to motorists and encourage everyone to use sober designated drivers.

According to the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration (NHTSA), checkpoints have provided the most effective documented results of any of the DUI enforcement strategies. Here are some of our statistics from Saturday's checkpoint:

- Vehicles through the checkpoint
- Vehicles screened and given a pamphlet with information about DUI
- 6 Standardized Field Sobriety Tests administered
- 3 DUI- Alcohol impaired suspects arrested
- 6 Drivers cited for operating a vehicle while unlicensed
- 0 Vehicles impounded
- 4 Citations issued for other Vehicle Code violations

Huntington Beach Police Department will be conducting another Sobriety/Drivers License Checkpoint on January 11<sup>th</sup>, 2014, in our ongoing commitment to lowering deaths and injuries upon our streets and highways.

Funding for this checkpoint is provided to the Huntington Beach Police Department by a grant from the California Office of Traffic Safety, through the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration, reminding everyone to continue to work together to bring an end to these tragedies.
